How can you help your child prepare for Early Years?

Please encourage your child's independence by

- Encouraging them to put their coats and shoes on.
- Avoid any clothes that are tricky to fasten.
- Toilet train your child.
- Encourage children to tidy their toys away at home.

Supporting your child with speech and language

In today's world with so many electronic devices, talk is sometimes forgotten!

- The amount of language children hear is very important. The more they hear, the more time you talk to them, the more likely they are to use different types of words that they are exposed to.
- Comment on their play. Don't question everything. Ask open ended questions so that it gives them opportunities to expand their vocabulary.
- Talk, talk, talk, is the key!

Nursery Curriculum

Our curriculum is designed to recognise children's prior experience and provide first hand learning based on their interests, needs and stages of development.

We place a huge emphasis on communication and language as well as personal, social and emotional development. Learning starts off on each session with a key worker group activity and then the children enjoy exciting child-initiated activities supported by adults. The ability to learn is underpinned by the teaching of basic skills, knowledge and values that equips our children for future success. Reading is at the heart of what we do in Nursery.

We ensure our topics and provision are stimulating and engaging for the children, building on their natural curiosity.

Reception Curriculum

In Reception we follow Little Wandle Phonics. We have a mixture of whole class teaching and small focused work activities. Our children love our topics and these prepare our children for Year 1.

Our topics are based on providing our children with "exciting

experiences." We provide a broad and balanced learning environment.

Children from the age of 3 who are toilet trained are able to join our breakfast club between 7.45am and 8.45am or our after school provision between 3.15pm and 6.00pm.

Transition to School

We aim to make the transition to school for our nursery children as smooth as possible.
